In a way that is unparalleled in the nation, the Family Preservation Center will provide information, resources, and services that have never been available before, thanks to Adams County, City of Aurora, ARPA funding, BOMA (Denver Metro Building Owners and Managers Association), (CRA) Colorado Roofing Association, and Colorado Access.

A number of tangible resources are available to ease emotional and financial burdens and to promote stability. In addition to parenting classes, case management, individual and family therapy, and experiential therapy (pottery, recording studio, children's theater stage, etc.), we will also offer family nights, after-school programming, a STEM lab, a drop-in center for teenagers, a food pantry, as well as many other services to encourage family formation and strengthen self-sufficiency.

Renovations are currently underway and the building is expected to open in Spring 2024.
